Snow and Ice Contract:

Resolution No 20

Resolution Approving Snow Removal and Ice Control Contract Between the County of Allegany and the Town of Wellsville

Whereas, a contract has been proposed between the County Allegany and this Town for the removal of snow from County Roads within the Town and for sanding or otherwise treating them for the purpose of removing the danger of snow and ice, and

Whereas, the Allegany County Board of Legislators did approve said Resolution passed on September 9, 2019 and

Whereas, this board feels that the term and conditions of said contract are fair and equitable, therefore, be it

Resolved:

- 1. That the proposed Snow Removal and Ice Control Contract between the County of Allegany and the Town of Wellsville, New York, for each mile contained in Appendix A County Road for the (3) seasons beginning with the 2019-2020 snow season and ending with the 2022 snow season, we approved.

That the Supervisor of this town is authorized and directed to execute the said contract in duplicate and the Town Clerk is directed to file one of the duplicate original contract in his or her office and to send a certified copy of this resolution to the clerk of the Allegany County Board of Legislators for filing in her office.

COMPUTER SUPPORT:

Arnold reports that he has been checking on computer support for the Town of Wellsville, he feels that it is something that the town needs to keep the computers in the Town of Wellsville running.

Motion: A motion was made by Miller to contract with Wellsville Technologies, LLC, 4269 Bolivar Road, Wellsville, NY to cover all the computers in all the town offices, software and drives are not covered in this plan. This contract would cover the rest of 2019 and all of 2020 (until December 31, 2020). Motion was seconded by Fish

Discussion: The board was concerned about the length of the contract and the amount of the contract, Miller will stop at Wellsville Technologies, LLC on this way to work and discuss the issues with the manager there. Graves stated that she would like clarification before we move ahead.

Motion: A revised motion was made by Miller to check with Wellsville Technologies, LLC on the length and cost of the contract not to exceed \$1,600.00, seconded by Fish/carried.

Park Cameras:

Arnold reports that the park will close at the end of October, he also stated that he is working with Wellsville Technologies, LLC to get the camera system up and working properly. The cameras will be updated and repositioned in the park, the information will be wired to the Town of Wellsville Highway building and the Wellsville Police Department will have full access to the report. The cost will be \$17,900.00 which will be taken out of the Park Renovation Fund.

Loader/Snowblower:

Bid Opening: Shutt reports that there were three bids for the loader/snowblower:

- 1. George & Swede Company \$303,700.00
- 2. Monroe Tractor \$325,122.68
- 3. Tracey _____ Equipment \$375,300.00

Shutt reports that George & Swede was the low bidder for the second time as well as the first time, we can not sustain this amount. Shutt has talked to George & Swede to see if they could do any better, they came back with a price of \$287,504.00 which Shutt feels the airport could manage.

Motion: A motion was made by Miller to accept the low bid of \$287,504.00 from George & Swede Company, seconded by Fish/carried.

BAN: A motion was made by Alsworth to BAN \$257,365 with a one (1) year early buy out option, seconded by Case/carried.

Snowblower: A motion was made by Miller to have the Airport Manager sell the current snowblower once the new one has arrived, seconded by Fish/carried.

Airport Budget Transfer:

Motion: A motion was made by Case to transfer \$6,462.21 from NY-01-0706-002 (Airport Capital Projects to EA5610.442 (Building Maintenance Fund) to cover the cost of an invoice from Reed Electric, seconded by Fish/carried.

Construct Conventional Hangar:

Miller reports that he will be sending a letter to Mr. Gerardo Mendoza, Director of Aviation Bureau explaining why the grant to repair hangar doors did not work out and the town is returning the funding to NYS Department of Transportation, less about \$20,000, already spent trying to make the project happen. Shutt stated that the hangar doors could not be repaired, and noted the long-term plan for the hangar doors call for airplanes to move out, with the building refurbished for other uses.
